Title I Parent Involvement Policy

The Parent Involvement Policy is designed with the input of parents/guardians, school administration and Title I staff. The purpose of the policy is to ensure parent involvement in their child/children's education and encourage communication and foster home/school partnerships.

Annual Parent Meeting

The district will hold an annual parent meeting. A brochure will be given to parents explaining the Title I program. The Parent involvement policy, along with parental rights and responsibilities, the school compacts, the curriculum in use, and the forms of assessment will be reviewed. Parent feedback will be gathered to assess the program's effectiveness and to help improve the Title I program.

Parent/Student Compact

At the beginning of the school year each child's parent/guardian will be given a learning compact that outlines the student/teacher/parent responsibilities. This compact must be signed by all three parties (or for the preschool version, just teacher and parent). This compact provides a complete overview of the expectations and responsibilities for everyone involved.

Schoolwide Schools

Title I services will be available to help all students meet state's performance standards. Parent involvement activities will be planned and presented to fulfill the requirements based on the outcomes of the school's Comprehensive Needs Assessment.

Target Assistance Schools

Title I services are provided to students based on performance requirements and input from teachers as well as other federal guidelines. Parents will be notified if their child qualifies for Title I services. Parent permission will be required for participation.

Communication Commitment

Parents are encouraged to visit their Title I areas and to express any questions or concerns they may have regarding Title I to either the Title I Project Manager or the Title I Instructional Assistant. Such concerns will be recorded in the child's folder respectively.

Additional Meetings

Opportunities for parents/guardians to ask questions, share experiences with other parents and gain information about ways to help their children succeed academically and socially will be made available throughout the school year.
