The next sentence(s) **GIVES** the quoted **EVIDENCE** followed by the source in parentheses.

The next sentence(s) **EXPLAIN** the **EVIDENCE**, **TELL WHY IT IS IMPORTANT** and, **EXPLAIN HOW IT SUPPORTS THE ARGUMENT**.

The final sentence of the paragraph **CONNECTS** the **EVIDENCE** back to the **THESIS**.

The first sentence of the paragraph **CONNECTS** the **ARGUMENT** to the **THESIS**.

The second sentence **INTRODUCES** the quoted **EVIDENCE** by offering a slight preview to the reader of what is to come by explaining it in your own words.

The next sentence(s) **GIVES** the quoted **EVIDENCE** followed by the source in parentheses.

The next sentence(s) **EXPLAIN** the **EVIDENCE**, **TELL WHY IT IS IMPORTANT** and, **EXPLAIN HOW IT SUPPORTS THE ARGUMENT**.

Following this explanation, write a sentence to **CONNECT** the **FIRST PIECE OF EVIDENCE** to the **SECOND**. For example, the second piece of evidence might elaborate or provide more detail, show cause and effect.
